Point of Honor

112 Cabell Street • Lynchburg, VA (434) 455-6226 • pointofhonor.org

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Point of Honor is a beautiful, two-story Federal style mansion, built in 1815. The property boasts scenic views of Downtown Lynchburg and the James River. Its most famous occupant was George Cabell, friend of Thomas Jefferson and personal physician to Patrick Henry. Come experience early 19th-century life with tours through the furnished home, gardens, kitchen dependency and Carriage House Gift Shop.

Anne Spencer House & Garden Museum

A Virginia Landmark on the National Register of Historic Places, this is the home of internationally acclaimed Harlem Renaissance poet and Civil Rights leader, Anne Spencer, who wrote on any available surface, including the walls of her home! During her lifetime, she shared intellectual respect and repartee with notables such as opera stars Marian Anderson and Paul Robeson and Civil Rights luminaries Thurgood Marshall and the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. The house is open by appointment but the beautifully restored gardens, which contain her famous writing cottage, Edankraal, are open daily without charge.



Old City Cemetery Museums & Arboretum

Established in 1806, the Old City Cemetery is the oldest municipal cemetery in Virginia still in use today. This extraordinary 27-acre public garden and "history park" is a village of five small museums touting the stories of the diverse population of the nearly 20,000 buried here including the graves of over 2,200 Civil War soldiers from 14 states. The grounds are filled with hundreds of varieties of native and heirloom plants, including the largest public collection of antique roses in the state of Virginia. Gates are open dawn to dusk, every day of the year.





Historic Sandusky & Civil War Center

A registered Virginia Historic Landmark and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Sandusky mansion stands as one of the finest examples of Federal style architecture in Virginia's Piedmont region. It served as Union headquarters during the Battle of Lynchburg and now serves as a museum to tell the stories of the Civil War, especially the Battle of Lynchburg and Hunters Raid and is a Civil War Trails tour site.

Miller-Claytor House & Garden

2200 Miller Claytor Lane Lynchburg, VA (434) 528-5353

The Miller-Claytor House, erected in 1791 for tavern keeper John Miller, is Lynchburg's only remaining 18th-century town house. Serving as a historic exhibit, the two-story frame building is an intriguing example of urban vernacular architecture. Thomas Jefferson allegedly proved to the owner of the house's garden that tomatoes were not poisonous by eating the fruit. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Open by appointment with garden open to the public from dawn to dusk.

South River Meeting House

5810 Fort Avenue Lynchburg, VA (434)-239-2548

The South River Meeting House was organized in 1757 when Sarah Lynch gave two acres of land for the first framed structure. Within 25 years, increased membership made a larger building necessary and John Lynch, founder of Lynchburg, gave 10 acres of land for this now restored stone building. Adjacent to the Meeting House is his grave site. Self-guided tours available daily.

Fort Early & Jubal Early Monument

3511 Memorial Avenue Lynchburg, VA

On the National Register of Historic Places, Fort Early is an American Civil War earthen fort, constructed as part of the outer defenses of Lynchburg under the command of Lt. General Jubal Early. It was critical in the holding of the city during the Battle of Lynchburg. In 1919, a 17-foot granite obelisk was erected to honor the confederate general. Grounds are open year-round from dusk to dawn.


National Civil War Chaplains Museum

The National Civil War Chaplains Museum uses displays, artifacts and murals to tell the diverse stories of the War Between the States and educate the public about the role of chaplains, priests, rabbis and religious organizations during the Civil War.


Legacy Museum of African-American History

Atop Monument Terrace, the Lynchburg Museum is housed within the Old Courthouse standing guard over the city. The museum shares stories about the people and events that shaped this region including antique toys, military items, fine art, furniture, vintage apparel, photographs and more.

Monument Terrace rises a breathtaking 139 steps overlooking scenic Downtown Lynchburg. The multiple landings offer monuments to honor Lynchburg citizens who fought and died in the Civil War, Spanish American War, World Wars I & II, Korea, Vietnam, plus POW-MIA and Purple Heart monuments.

Touch a turtle, feed a toad, or just take in the "wild" sights of The Nature Zone. The Nature Zone is a hands-on environmental education center that offers a world of fun and excitement for all ages! Admission is free and open Friday and Saturday from Noon to 4:00pm.

The Jerry Falwell Museum is located on the Campus of Liberty University and houses memorabilia, videos, and pictures of his life including a library of Falwell's writings including books and personal letters.



Dining

Shopping

Stroll the Lynchburg Community Market, the third oldest continuously running farmers market in the country, and shop for fresh fruits and vegetables and beautiful works of art.





Percival's Island Natural Area

Part of the RiverWalk trail, Percival's Island is one of the most popular natural areas in Lynchburg with earthen trails criss-crossing its length. The heavily wooded island was once a busy industrial area, including a train yard, but there are few signs of its previous uses now. Enjoy the shade and river breezes while bird and wildlife watching, walking or biking, or fishing.

Blackwater Creek Athletic & Natural Area 515 Monticello Avenue Lynchburg, VA

This park has a little bit of everything to offer visitors, including the only off-leash dog park in Lynchburg. The park also includes connection to the Creekside Trail, which leads to the Blackwater Creek Natural Area, restrooms and a multi-purpose lighted field that accommodates most field played sports.



Miller Park 2100 Park Avenue Lynchburg, VA

Miller Park was Lynchburg's first park! This almost 30-acre park includes two picnic shelters, the unique and historic Aviary (both can be rented for weddings, parties, and other events), and the Miller Park Pool, the only public outdoor pool in Lynchburg.



Ivy Creek Park & Lake 118 Clemmons Lake Place Lynchburg, VA

Ivy Creek Park is a green oasis which includes the six-acre Clemmons Lake, multi-use trails, picnic and play areas, as well as an auxiliary site for the naturalists of the Nature Zone and some of their aquatically-inclined reptiles and amphibians.



Hollins Mill Park 521 Hollins Mill Road Lynchburg, VA

This popular park provides large shade trees in a lush creekside field with handicap access picnic tables and grills. Cast your fishing pole beside the picturesque and historic Hollins Mill Dam. The park also includes trail connections to the Blackwater Creek Bikeway and the Point of Honor Trail section.

Riverside Park 2238 Rivermont Avenue Lynchburg, VA

One of the most beloved, and second oldest, parks in Lynchburg, Riverside

Park is over 49 acres of rolling parkland with lovely wooded walking trails providing views of the James River and beyond. Weddings can be held at the Overlook alongside the Alpine Trail, Lynchburg's first dedicated hiking trail, and kids can enjoy the playground and cool down in summer at the popular Sprayground.



Peaks View Park 170 Ivy Creek Drive Lynchburg, VA

Peaks View Park is the second largest park in Lynchburg and offers both passive and active recreation for the entire family. The park has three lighted tennis courts, seven multi-purpose fields (soccer, football, softball, baseball), volleyball courts, a basketball court, mountain bike trails and a disc golf course. The park also has a popular playground.



Riverfront Park 1100 Jefferson Street Lynchburg, VA

Riverfront Park is located adjacent to the James River in Downtown Lynchburg. This large grassy open area hosts numerous festivals and special events throughout the year. On warm days, cool off in the Zero Depth Fountain. The park connects to the RiverWalk trail along its northern edge which leads to Percival's Island Natural Area.

The mountain offers cross-country and gravity-fed trails for both hiking and mountain biking. Directional signs and map kiosks provide easy navigation for trail users. 

The Academy's theatres feature entertainment by nationally and internationally recognized artists.



D-Day Memorial

The Memorial honors the Allied forces who shared in the invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944 during World War II. With its stylized English garden, haunting invasion tableau, and striking Victory Plaza, the Memorial stands as a powerful tribute to the valor, fidelity, and sacrifice of D-Day participants. Visitors can expect both an educational as well as emotional experience, leaving with a clear understanding of the scale and sacrifices made during the largest amphibious landing the world has ever seen.

Poplar Forest

This unique octagonal National Historic Landmark is one of two homes designed and built by Thomas Jefferson for his personal use. Experience the incredible journey of understanding and confirming Jefferson's brilliant design and its restoration in a process that mirrors Jefferson's long, painstaking effort to create this unique and personal work.

Red Hill is the last home and burial place of Patrick Henry, American Founding Father and first post-colonial Virginia Governor. Best known for his "Give Me Liberty or Give Me Death" speech. Henry was a great statesman as well as a farmer and lawyer. This estate has beautiful views and vast open space perfect for the annual 4th of July celebration and November Bluegrass, Barbecue, and Brew Festival.


Blue Ridge Parkway

The majestic Blue Ridge Parkway, with its many picturesque overlooks and points of interest is known as "America's Most Popular Scenic Drive" and is one of the most visited sections of the National Park System. From mile post 63.7, it is just a short drive to Lynchburg. The nation's longest rural parkway traverses both Virginia and North Carolina and contains countless outdoor recreational opportunities for all to enjoy. The Peaks of Otter, a trio of mountain peaks visible from Lynchburg, overlook the region. Wildlife exhibits, walking and biking trails, picnic areas and a lodge are available along this section of the Parkway.

Booker T. Washington

Located near Smith Mountain Lake, this National Park is the birthplace of Booker T. Washington. Born a slave on this 207-acre farm of James Burroughs, Washington would later become the first principal of Tuskegee Normal and Industrial School. He served as an adviser, author and orator, whose past would influence his philosophies as the most influential African American of his era. Explore his birthplace with walking trails, picnic areas and more.

Natural Bridge

Once owned by Thomas Jefferson, Natural Bridge is one of the oldest tourist destinations in the United States. The bridge has been included in several "Seven Natural Wonders of the World" lists and is a designated National Historic Landmark, Virginia Historic Landmark, and listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Caverns at Natural Bridge are the east coast's deepest descending 34 stories into the earth! Also visit the Monacan Indian Living History Village and enjoy hiking on the surrounding trails.



Avoca Museum

Located in nearby Altavisita, Avoca is an American Queen Anne-style house built in 1901. Designated a Virginia Historic Landmark and listed in the National Register of Historic Places, Avoca is the home site of Revolutionary Patriot Colonel Charles Lynch, brother of Lynchburg's founder, John Lynch.

Appalachian Trail appalachiantrail.org

Part of the National Park Service, the Appalachian Trail (A.T.) is a 2,180+ mile long public hiking trail traversing the Appalachian Mountains between Georgia and Maine. More of the A.T. passes through Virginia than any other state with elevation ranges from 265 to 5,500 feet. Lynchburg is 23 miles at its closest point to the trail and provides all the amenities a hiker needs to refresh before continuing the journey.

This enjoyable CD driving tour, narrated by Civil War authority James Robertson, Jr., visits eight sites critical to the events of June 17-18, 1864, the Battle of Lynchburg. 


