Downtown

If you really want to experience the culture of Lynchburg, set your sights on downtown. Restaurants that have been started by innovative chefs dot the streets, the James River creates a beautiful barrier to the city, and street art will guide your path. Our downtown is best navigated on foot—when you have a chance to stop and look further as you go—but our hopper and bus systems make frequent stops along the hilled streets, to make your trip even easier.

Arts

Art is an incredibly important part of who we are as a city. Our Artisan Trail will give you the must-see galleries, exhibits and artisans, but we also encourage you to wander off the beaten path a bit and find some of the art that is being created by our community. Stop to listen while someone plays at the many public pianos around the city (or sit down and play a tune of your own!), share some photos of the street art that you find, or get to know an artist that you see working in a coffee shop. That's the thing about art—you get to experience it however you want.



Blue Ridge Parkway

As you spend time in Lynchburg, you'll quickly learn that we love being outside. That's why we have miles of biking, hiking and walking paths that weave throughout the city and it's why you will always find people outside no matter the time of year. Lynchburg is in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, with quick access to the Blue Ridge Parkway from multiple locations. Unplug for a few hours and explore the mountains, and get a view of Lynchburg from a different angle.

History

Lynchburg was (and still is today), a pretty transient community. In its early days, it was an import/export town via the James River. It then grew to a major rail community. And today, with a handful of colleges and universities in the city, it's still a place where people from all over the world come and go. That movement has shaped our city and, in many cases, it's shaped our nation. Battles have been fought here, ideas have turned into inventions, and presidents have chosen to call the Lynchburg region their home. When you're here, give yourself some time to explore our history, and perhaps make a little of your own.

Food
