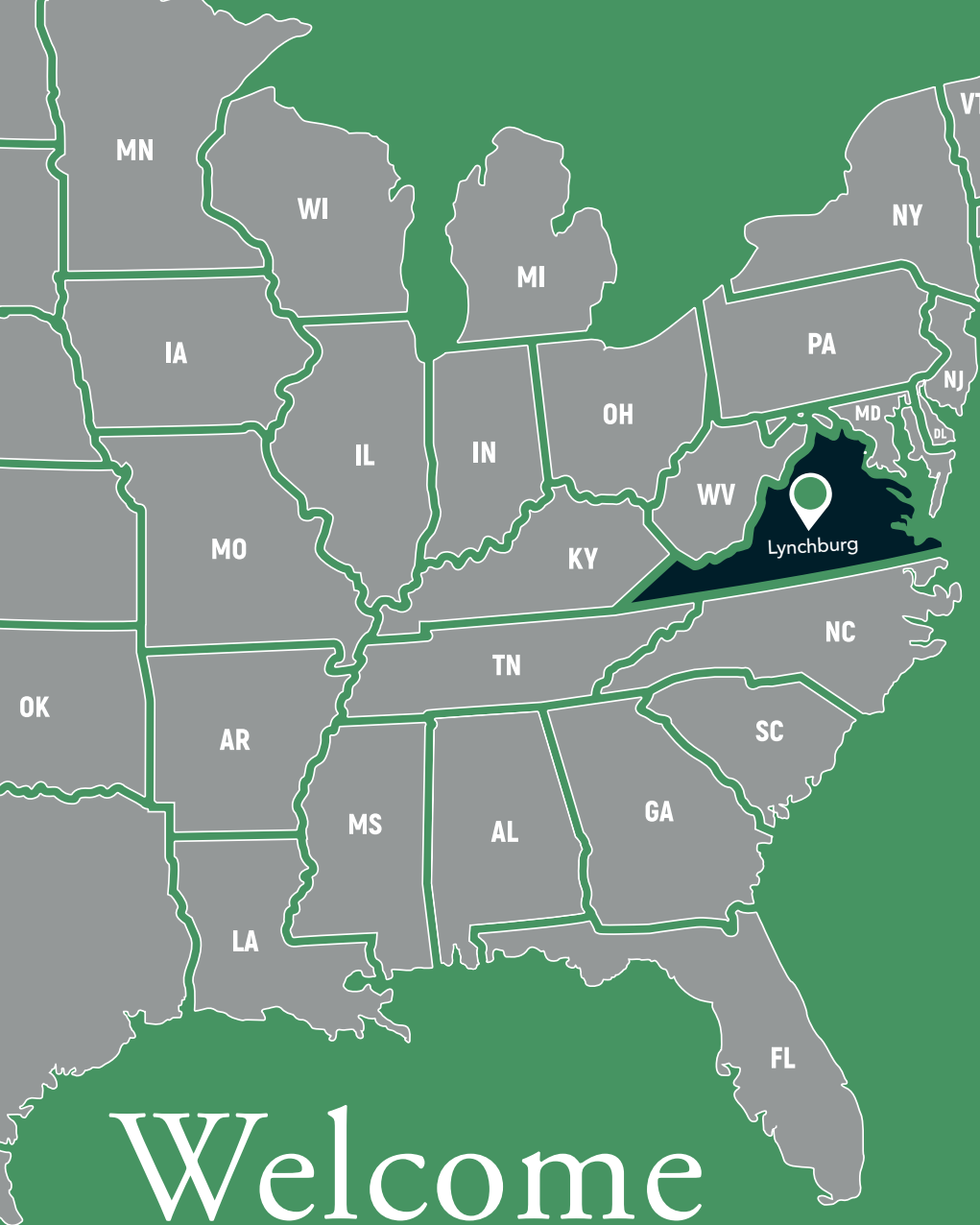

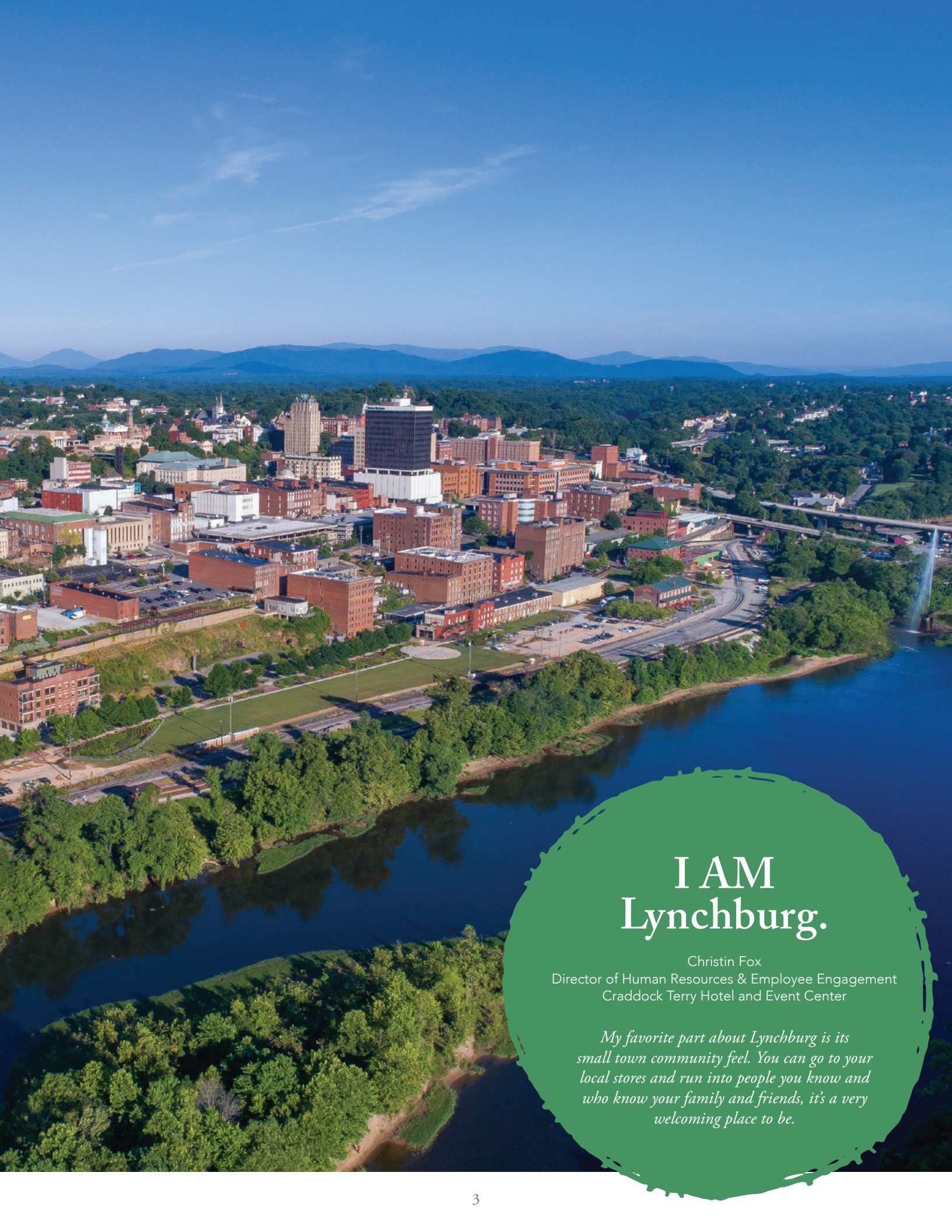

Lynchburg, welcoming newcomers from the start

In 1757, seventeen year old John Lynch, a Quaker, took over the family ferry business carrying people and goods across the James River. In 1786, Lynch petitioned the General Assembly of Virginia for a charter to establish a town on the bluffs above the ferry. The petition was granted and the town of Lynchburg was founded. Today, Langley Fountain marks the point where Mr. Lynch's ferry landed on the Lynchburg side of the river.

1 Stable, Flourishing Economy
Our industry makeup and workforce is made up of firms of all sizes, making our economy stable and diverse. This means more job security and peace of mind for our community. 4 Low Cost of Living

In fact, the average cost of living is 14.2% lower than the United States average, which gives our community members a higher disposable income to invest in what they love. Lynchburg is even rated one of the Best Value Cities in the U.S. by Kiplinger!

Equipped with a world-class health care system, Lynchburg has many walk-in clinics, urgent care, dentists, orthodontists, two major hospitals, and even alternative healthcare consultants to keep you healthy.

6 Safe Neighborhoods

Grab a coffee with little to no wait, enjoy a traffic free drive to work, or immerse yourself in the forests and streams of our urban trails meandering throughout the city.

Outdoor activity is plentiful with numerous parks and trails, athletic facilities for tournaments or just having fun. Lynchburg is a designated "Runner Friendly City" by the Road Runners Club of America and takes health and fitness seriously hosting the annual Genworth Virginia 10 Miler and Amazing Mile Kids Run. We also take our fun seriously, as Lynchburg is home to many wine and music festivals, bicycle treks, and cultural events.

The arts play center stage in Lynchburg starting with the venerable Academy Center of the Arts. Bringing names like Wynton Marsallis and Mavis Staples to their grande dame stage, the Academy is the heartbeat of our Downtown. We also support countless theater groups, opera and choral companies, symphony orchestra, art galleries and museums, and the Lynchburg Museum System. Plus, with six liberal arts colleges/universities in the area, opportunities for workshops, classes, camps, lectures, and exhibits abound.

Getting around Lynchburg is a breeze. You can arrive almost anywhere within city limits in less than 15 minutes. And shopping for those things you need to make your new house a home is easy with malls, boutique and antique shops, and most big box stores close at hand.

There are so many ways to engage with your new community, join a team or league through Lynchburg Parks & Recreation, volunteer for a non-profit organization, or take a workshop provided by a local business. It's a great way to make new friends and support the community.

Lynchburg has a lot to offer as far as outdoor activities. We have the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains to the west and the James River runs by the face of Downtown Lynchburg, and many other outdoor opportunities all centered around Lynchburg.

Social Scene in Lynchburg

With the James River at our feet, the Blue Ridge Mountains just 30 minutes away and a thriving Downtown scene, Lynchburg offers plenty of opportunities for recreation, entertainment, and places to connect and make new friends.

Lynchburg is a foodie city serving up a diversity of innovative restaurants and food trucks, micro-breweries, and wineries in the surrounding countryside to visit. Our chefs know how to please most any palate and offer tasty options for vegetarians, vegans, and those eating Gluten Free.

Stroll, bike or run the miles of urban trails that wind through the City, paddle or fish on the James River, or get real adventurous with year-round skiing and snowboarding at Snowflex Centre. Take the kids to Amazement Square, a hands-on experience with a four story network of tunnels and zip lines to help kids traverse from floor to floor. Indoor adventure abounds as well with rock climbing, escape room games, trampoline park, and museums and art galleries galore.



Festivals and concerts happen year-round at Riverfront Park and nearby attractions. Annual events like the Thomas Jefferson Wine Festival, Bluegrass, Barbecue & Brew Festival, and the Virginia Wine & Garlic Festival bring thousands out to taste the fruits of Virginia's agricultural labors and cultural events like the Lynchburg International Festival celebrate the many ethnic traditions that contribute to the diversity of our city.

Learning in Lynchburg

With five colleges and universities, it's easy to see why we value education and investing in our citizens.

Of individuals ages 25 to 64 in our city, 34.5% have a bachelor's degree or higher, which compares with 33.4% nationally. Last year, Lynchburg's higher education institutions conferred more than 21,000 graduate and undergraduate degrees.

The Lynchburg Beacon of Hope, a local born non-profit, has launched the *Stay Close, Go Far Promise Scholarship Program*. This scholarship program gives all graduates of Lynchburg City High Schools—roughly

550 students—\$8,000 per student over two years to attend Central Virginia Community College, and a like amount over four years to attend Liberty University, Centra College of Nursing, Randolph College, Sweet Briar College or the University of Lynchburg. We are proud to be one of only 200 communities in the country and the first in Virginia with such a program.

Exploring in Lynchburg

The City of Lynchburg is quintessentially known for our "Lynchburg Legacies" - locations, sights, and experiences that will give you an idea of who we are as a community.

The city's relationship with the James River has long been one of commerce and recreation and that tradition continues today. Miles of urban trails meander through the city along the river and its tributaries providing nature breaks for walking, biking, and fishing. On the water, you can enjoy hours of kayaking and canoeing, or just splash around to cool off on a warm day.

The Blue Ridge Mountains provide a breathtaking backdrop for the city and it's only a 35 minute drive to hop on the Blue Ridge Parkway, America's most visited National Park. Stop at orchards and wineries along the way, there's always something to uncover just around the bend.

To really get to know the city, explore our Downtown with its distinctive 19th and 20th century architecture now renewed into boutique shops, chef inspired

eateries, and the third oldest continuously operating farmers market in the country, the Lynchburg Community Market.
